NARRATIVE FOR W.B. WELLS & ASSOC., INC. SURVEY 85-54 DATED MAY 3, 1985

"UMATILLA GOLF & COUNTRY CLUB"

The purpose of this survey was to set the boundaries of the tract shown and to show other pertinent points relating to said boundaries.

Control was established by holding Deed bearing between the "X" found in a stone approximately 410 feet Southerly of the Southeast corner of the tract surveyed, and an iron rod found at the Northeast corner of said tract. The North line was determined by running from the iron rod at the Northeast corner of said tract to a Corps of Engineers monument stamped A-2017-1 under a concrete wall approximately 4,175 feet Westerly; said monument was set to mark the Northerly boundary of the original tract disposed of by the Corps of Engineers. In running the North line, we also ran over another Corps monument stamped AA-A at approximately 1,967 feet Westerly of the iron rod at the Northeast corner of the tract surveyed.

The South line of the tract was determined by holding to iron rods found on the centerline of Walla Walla Street as platted in "MC NARY TOWNSITE", as our South line was an Easterly extension of the North line of Walla Walla Street.

The most Southerly West line of the tract surveyed was called as the Northerly extension of the East line of Cowlitz Avenue; the monuments found in centerline were also used here.

The Northerly South line was monumented to the North line of John Day Street; the centerline of John Day Street was shown to be 1,205 feet South of the centerline of Kalama Street, 50 feet wide, as shown on the Army Corps Map, DWG No. WW-RE-205, which is called the "McNary Townsite Disposal" map. The North line of the tract surveyed was called, in deed, to be the South line of Kalama Street. The width of John Day Street is shown now to be 60.0 feet wide by all available maps, so was held to be so. The North line of John Day Street, therefore, was held to be 1,150 feet South of the North line of the tract surveyed; this also fit with the deeds given by Jerry Smith, the original owner of the whole townsite, between the North line of Klickitat Street and the Westerly South line of the Golf Course Tract surveyed.

The West line of the overall tract was called by deed to be "the East line of the Easterly curb of Willamette Avenue", and that line was held. For the centerline of Willamette Avenue, I held a line 2,900 feet West of the East line of the tract surveyed, because it was shown to be 2,825.0 feet West of the centerline of Wind Avenue, as a 50.0 foot wide street, and the East line of the tract surveyed was called to be 100.0 feet East of the $\underline{\text{WEST}}$ line of Wind Avenue, thus 2,900.0 feet. This fit within small limits with the iron rod found at the intersection of the South line of John Day Street and the East line of Willamette Avenue.

The Hotel Tract (Tract II) at the Westerly Southwest corner of the Golf Course was described by metes and bounds, and was monumented to the East line of Willamette Avenue and the North line of John Day Street. I had no problem with that, but the bearings and distances from the section corner were not even close to fitting the corner of the tract. I, therefore, have shown measured bearings and distances, as well as deed.

NOTE ALSO that there is a 20.0 foot strip immediately adjacent to the East of the Hotel Tract (Tract II) which still belongs to the original grantee, because it was never deeded to Grayson Inns.
