Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:  At the location of the stone, I set a 1.25" x 30" galvanized iron pipe with 2.25" brass cap stamped as shown in the diagram. Buried the stone alongside the pipe. Top of monument is 6" above the ground with a collar of stone.  For references, I set four 5/8" by 24" rebars with 1.25" red plastic caps stamped ORLS 852 and WA WALS 13922 as described below: a power pole lies west of the corner with a Umatilla County Survey Monument sign attached; a rebar bears N01°51'E, 57.03 feet under a north bound fence line; a rebar bears S0°05'E, 38.61 feet at the base of a railroad tie in the south bound fence; a rebar bears S59°34'W, 66.00 feet under a north - south fence; a rebar bears N40°23'W, 84.87 feet under a north - south fence;
