

TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At proportionate position, I set a 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30" aluminum pipe with 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " aluminum cap, marked as shown below, 7 inches in the ground, in a mound of stone 3 ft. diam., from which:

An 11 in. Ponderosa Pine bears North 40° East, a distance of 139.15 feet, marked 1/4 S24 BT. A 10 inch Ponderosa Pine bears South 31° East, a distance of 57.65 feet, marked 1/4 S25 BT. A 13 inch Douglas Fir bears South 16° West, a distance of 28.75 feet, marked 1/4 S25 BT. An 8 inch Douglas Fir bears North 53° West, a distance of 55.95 feet, marked 1/4 S25 BT.
