DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:
Found 2 ½" x 30" iron pipe with 2 ½" brass cap marked as shown below, loose, lying horizontally on ground next to mound of stone. Corner position reestablished by record distances of Survey Number 06-509-B to the quarter corner common to Section 26 and 27 (as set by said survey) and the Section corner common to Sections 21, 22, 27 and 28. Position falls in center of mound of stone. From which:

A 22 inch Ponderosa Pine bears North 42° West, a distance of 16.85 feet. No blaze marks visible, but has a bearing tree tag marked South 45°50' East 16.1 feet to corner monument. Tag stamped PLS 933.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED

TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At the position, I reset the monument, 12 inches in the ground to bedrock, in a mound of stone 3 ft. in diameter, from which, new bearing trees:

- A 14 inch Ponderosa Pine bears South 10° East, a distance of 36.50 feet, marked T1N R35E S26 BT.
- A 15 inch Douglas Fir bears South 36° West, a distance of 62.75 feet, marked T1N R35E S27 BT.
- A 17 inch Ponderosa Pine bears North 23° East, a distance of 36.60 feet, marked T1N R35E S22 BT,

I set a steel fencepost approx. 1 foot East of corner monument. Raised mound of stone alongside.
