Corner originally established by Herman D. Gradon under GLO contract number 452, dated June 16, 1882. Surveyor General record states: Set a basalt stone 14x12x4 ins 9 ins in the ground for closing cor to Secs 2 + 3 marked CC with 2 notches on E and 4 notches on Wedges from which:
A pine 20 ins diam bears S20°E 144 lks dist mkd T1S R36E S2 CC BT A pine 24 ins diam bears S20°W 30 lks dist mkd T1S R36E S3 CC BT No other trees within limits and raised a mound of stone alongside

Corner perpetuated by Lawrence D. Holmes under BLM group no. 1184 with instructions dated Sept. 29, 1983. His notes state: Point for closing cor of secs 2 and 3, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner. Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins diam, 24 ins in the ground in a collar of stone, 2½ ft base to top, with brass cap marked: (markings shown below) from which:
A ponderosa pine, 18 ins diam, bears S7 3/4°E, 49 lks dist mkd T1S R36E S2 CC BT A ponderosa pine, 15 ins diam, bears S33 3/4°W, 164 lks dist mkd T1S R36E S3 CC BT

No record of subsequent monumentation found in Umatilla County survey records.

Description of corner evidence found:

Found a standard BLM brass cap monument marked as shown:

BLM BEARING TREES Found a 14 inch diameter Ponderosa Pine S7 3/4°E, 49 lks, dead and standing with scribes visible.

Found a 16 inch diameter Ponderosa Pine S33 3/4°W, 164 lks, live and vigorous with scribes visible.

Found steel fenceposts approximately 5 feet South and West with Property Boundary signs and a Land Survey Monument sign on the Southerly post.

Bearing and distance to the BLM bearing trees is as per the BLM notes. I find no obvious errors.

See map of survey dated September, 1989. Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner: From the found BLM corner monument:

New Bearing Tree: A 18 inch diameter Ponderosa Pine bears S80°E, 11.04 feet marked T1S R36E S2 CC BT

Painted a 6 inch red band around all Bearing Trees and attached Bearing Tree and Land Survey monument signs.
