## Description of corner evidence found:

Found  $14 \times 10 \times 8$  in. basalt stone set in ground in mound of stone marked CC with 5 notches on East and 1 notch on West edges.

Found down fir, 24 in. diam. bearing approximately \$50 $^{\rm O}$ W 32 ft. dist. from stone, blaze grown over.

Found rotten fir log, bearing approximately NI5°W 13 ft. dist. from stone.

Accepted stone as corner position.

## Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner

Set 30 in. x 2 in. Iron pipe with 3 in. brass cap marked as shown 20 in. In the ground and raised a mound of stone around pipe for the closing corner between Sections 5 & 6, from which new BT's -

A ponderosa pine 24 in. diem. bears N 49V 69.8 ft. dist. marked TIN R36E S32 BT.

A fir 18 in. diam. bears \$85°E 100 ft. dist. marked TIS, R36E \$5 CC BT.

A ponderosa pine 16 in. diam. bears \$50°W 44 ft. dist. marked . TIS R36E \$6 CC RT.

Distances taken to a brass washer in the blaze of each tree. Set a steel fence post approximately 5 ft. West from corner with "Attention" sign attached.
