A pine 18 ins. diam. bears \$75°E 89 lks. dist. marked 1/4 \$ BT.

A pine 6 ins. diam. bears \$60°W 67 lks. dist. marked 1/4 \$ BT.

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(No subsequent remonumentations in county records)

## Description of corner evidence found:

Found 35 in. pine standing in good condition, grown over blaze clearly visible, bearing S60°W 44.2 ft. from corner position.

Found an 18 in. pine stump with all scribing clearly visible, bearing  $575^{\circ}E$  58.8 ft. dist. from the corner position.

## Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner

Set a 30 in. x  $2\frac{1}{2}$  in. Iron pipe with 3 in. brass cap marked as shown 25 in. in the ground for the 1/4 Sec. Cor. between Sec. 14 & 13 from which a new BT -

A 18 in. pondorosa pine bears S44°E 26.8 ft. dist. marked T1S R36E 1/4 S13 BT.

Distance taken to a brass washer in the blaze of the tree. Set a steel fence post approximately 5 ft. East from corner with Forest Boundary sign attached.

Used steel tape and magnetic compass with  $declanation = 20^{\circ}$  East.
