
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment: Corner established in 1882 by Herman D. Gradon, under General Land Office Contract No. 452.

Surveyor General Records states:

Set a basalt stone 16 x 12 x 4 ins. II ins. in the ground for 1/4 Sec. Cor. marked 1/4 on N face from which a pine 5 ins. diam. bears N 15° E 62 lks. dist. marked 1/4 S BT. No other tree within limits and raised a mound of stone alongside.

(No subsequent remonumentations in county records)

Description of corner evidence found:

Found 8 in. pine dead and down with scribing visible. Bearing N15 $^{\circ}$ E 41 ft. from 16 x 12 x 4 ins. stone with chipped face. Stone is tipped over on steep ground. Established corner position at stone.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner

Set $2\frac{1}{2}$ in. x 30 in. Iron pipe with bress cap marked as shown 25 in. In the ground and placed 16 x 12 x 4 in. stone South and alongside pipe for the 1/4 corner to Sections 17 and 00 and raised a mound of stone around the pipe, from which a new EY - a 24 in. pine boars N 50° W 63.8 ft. dist. marked

TIS R36E 1/4 S 17 BT. Distance taken to a brass washer in the blaze of the BT.

Sat a steel fence post approximately 5 ft. West of corner with "Attention" sign attached.

Corner laying on open E-W ridge sloping East.

REGISTERED PROFESSIONAL LAND SURVEYOR Used steel tape and magnetic compass with declanation = 20^{0} East.

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
