
History of original corner establishment:

Corner originally established by Henry Meldrum under GLO contract number 450, dated June 11, 1882. Surveyor General record states:

Set basalt stone 18x10x6 ins 12 in in ground for cor to secs 3, 4, 9 + 10 marked with 5 notches on S + 3 on E edges, and raised mound of stone alongside. Pits impracticable in open glade on hillside 500 ft. above creek from which;

A pine 50 in diam bears S32°W 87 lks dist marked T1S R37E S9 BT



No record of subsequent monumentation found in Umatilla County survey records.

Description of corner evidence found:

Found a stone 14x10x7 inches marked with 5 grooves on one face and 3 grooves on another.

Found a 50 inch diameter Ponderosa Pine root hole S32°W, 87 links with tree dead, down and very rotted approximately 20 feet Southwest of the root hole with no marks visible.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the

original location of this corner: In place of the found original corner stone, I set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30" aluminum pipe with aluminum cap marked as shown, 21 inches in the ground, from which:

New Bearing Trees:
A 12 inch diameter Ponderosa Pine bears N13°E, 122.20 feet marked T1S R37E S3 BT
A 14 inch diameter Douglas Fir bears S48°E, 190.60 feet marked T1S R37E S10 BT
A 11 inch diameter Ponderosa Pine bears S24°W, 49.20 feet marked T1S R37E S9 BT
A 11 inch diameter Douglas Fir bears N80°W, 62.47 feet marked T1S R37E S4 BT

Set a steel fencepost approximately 5 feet North with land survey monument sign attached.

Raised a mound of stone around monument, 3 ft. base to top of cap.

Painted a 6 inch red band around all BTs and attached Bearing tree and land survey monument signs.

Buried the original corner stone South and alongside of monument.

I hereby certify that the above corner point was perpetuated as hereon described on August 20, 1989.

I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of new accessories. I used 17° East magnetic declination and the distances are to a 50d spike driven in the right side of the root crown. I attached a brass washer marked OPLS 644 to the BT blaze.
