CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

T 2N, R 32E., W.M.

History of original corner establishment:

Corner was originally established by Daniel Chaplin, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, under Contract No. 107, dated September 21, 1884.

 Moody, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, in Contract No. 164, dated October 4, 1871, established a new corner. This new corner superceded that corner established under Contract No. 107.


Currin and Noland, U.S. Deputy Surveyors, under Special Contract dated May 4, 1887, did not recover mody's corner and re-established a 7 X 8 X 12 stong, parked 1/4 on the North fate as the corner point. Pits were dug 5 1/2 East and West of the corner stone.

Several tips to this cornr have been made in various surveys recorded in Record of Private Surveys Books $1\ \mbox{and}\ 2.$

A number of more recent private surveys (1950's and 1960's) have noted the recovery of a stone at this corner point.

The corner stone was remonumented by PLS 506 in 1974. No record of the remonumentation is available.

Description of corner evidence found:

Found a 2 1/2" brass cap on a 1 1/4" galv. iron pipe, protruding 2" from a mound of earth, in good condition. The cap is marked as shown on corner diagram.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Set steel fence post Northwest of corner and attached witness corner sign. From the existing corner monument:

A 5/8" by 30" iron pin with 1 1/2" yellow plastic cap marked "W.R. Wells PLS 1106" bears N 73°W 29.20°. Set steel fence post near reference monument and attached bearing object sign. A 5/8" by 30" iron pin with 1 1/2" yellow plastic cap marked "W.R. Wells PLS 1106" bears S 11°W 31.40'. Set steel fence post near reference monument and attached bearing object sign. The 5/8" by 30" iron pin with 1 1/2" yellow plastic cap marked "W.R. Wells PLS 1106", monumenting the Northwest corner of the Assisted Living Facilities Tract bears N 62°00'40"E 480.17'. The 5/8" by 30" iron pin with 1 1/2" yellow plastic cap marked "W.R. Wells PLS 1106", monumenting the Southwest corner of the Assisted Living Facilities Tract bears S 70°46'45"E 741.79'.
