ERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

2N, R 32E., W.M.

History of original corner establishment:

This corner was originally established by Daniel Chaplin, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, under Contract No. 107, dated September 21, 1864. The original notes state that at the corner, a stone, 24 % 14 % 5 was set for the corner.

In County Survey No. 147, in 1902, John Kimbrell, County Surveyor, recovered the corner.

Survey No. D-5-B, in 1967, indicates a stone found for the corner. Survey No. D-4, in 1967, indicates a found stone which was replaced with a brass cap.

Survey No. 85-157-C, in 1985, indicates a brass cap found.

In Survey No. 90-50-C, a stone in stone mound was recovered and remonumented with a $2\,^{\circ}1/2^{\circ}$ brass cap on a $1\,^{\circ}1/4^{\circ}$ galv. iron pipe.

Description of corner evidence found:

2 1/2" brass cap on 1 1/4" galv. iron pipe, in stone mound, from which: A 3' by 3' by 1' out of ground rock outcrop bears N 54°W - 21.1' marked "X BO" on Southeast top.
A 1 1/2' by 1' by 1' out of ground rock outcrop bears S 79°E - 33.2' marked "X BO" on West face.
A 3' by 1 1/2' by 1 1/2' out of ground rock in place bears S 18°E - 75.9' marked "X BO" on top.
A 5' by 3' by 1 1/2' out of ground rock outcrop bears S 46°W - 40.7' marked "X BO" on top.

Found a steel fence post 3' south of monument with a Witness Corner sign attached.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

From the found brass cap monument, these additional accessories were set: A 5/8" by 30" iron pin bears N 41 $1/2^\circ W$ - 26.0' capped with a yellow plastic cap marked "W,R WELLS, PLS 1106". A 5/8" by 30" iron pin bears N 30 $1/2^\circ E$ - 22.4' capped with a yellow plastic cap marked "W.R. WELLS, PLS 1106". A 5/8" by 30" iron pin bears S 64°E - 28.7' capped with a yellow plastic cap marked "W.R. WELLS, PLS 1106". A 5/8" by 30" iron pin bears S 51°W - 24.7' capped with a yellow plastic cap marked "W.R. WELLS, PLS 1106".

Set a steel fence post , on rough line, approximately 1 foot from each pin with a Bearing Object sign attached.
