
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

HISTORY OF **ORIGINAL** CORNER ESTABLISHMENT:

This monument was set to replace a prior monument that was destroyed during the construction of a bridge in 1999 over Patawa Creek on Goad Road. previous monument was set by William Wells LS 1106 in 1992, see C.S. 92-92-C.



DESCRIPTION OF CORNER EVIDENCE FOUND:

A 2 1/2" brass cap on a 30" x 1 1/4" iron pipe.

Four brass washers set as bearing objects

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

Set a 2" aluminum cap upon a 5/8" X 30" iron rod marked:

A. P. A. T2N R 32 E | 1/4 | R 33 E S 13 | LS 2872 1999

Buried 5" below surface of gravel road shoulder.

From which:

A brass washer bears N 61 1/2° E, 92.29', and is nailed with an aluminum nail to PP&L pole.

A 1 1/2" stainless steel washer stamped "AP&A" bears S 82° E, 54.22', and is nailed with a "PK" nail to the southern post of a wire gate.

A brass washer bears N 86 1/2° W, 26.73', and is nailed with an aluminum nail to pole no. 138561.

A brass washer bears N 30° W, 61.03', and is nailed with an aluminum nail to a gatepost.

The brass washers are stamped "W.R. Wells, PLS 1106, and Bearing Object signs are nailed above each washer.

LOCAL DESCRIPTION:

The monument falls +/- 75' south of the bridge, +/- 30 feet south of sign "MILE 2" and 9.0' ENE of the south end of a 2' CMP.
