Evidence Found: None. A road constructed along the section line probably removed Redfield's monument. Found the above 1/4 and 1/16 corners.		
Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:		
Using Redfield's monuments and Krumbein's filed record of survey I-135-B as references, I set a 1" iron rebar with a 2" aluminum cap stamped as shown in the diagram above. The top of the cap was set flush with the ground. The monument is south and west of a of a broken down fence rock crib in the road at the base of the cut slope. From which: An iron rebar bears N00°15'E, 68.52' immediately uphill of a steel fence post; An iron rebar bears N83°45'E, 96.57' in an old rock jack stone mound; An iron rebar bears S10°35'E, 48.29' at the northeast corner of a watering trough; An iron rebar bears S45°34'E, 153.89' in a stone mound with fence post immediately uphill from the road. Each rebar is 5/8" x 24" and has a 2 3/8" diameter red plastic cap, stamped ORLS0852 and WALS13922.		
The bearings are true.
