PREVIOUS RENEWALS/SURVEYS ETC.: Most recent approved GLO survey was by Currin and Noland under Special Contract, dated May 4, 1887, record states: A pine tree, 20 ins. in diam., which I marked for cor. to Tps. 1 and 2 N., Rs. 34 and 35 E., T 1 N R 35 E S 6 on S.E., T. 2 N. S. 31 on N.E., T 2 N R 34 E S 36 on N.W., T 1 N R 34 E S 1 on S.W., and 6 notches on N. S. E. and W. edges, from which:

A fir, 14 ins. in diam., bears S.10°E., dist. 171 lks., marked T 1 N R 35 E S 6 B T. A fir, 14 ins. in diam., bears S.70° W., dist. 67 lks. marked R 34 E S 1 B T. A pine, 24 ins. in diam., bears N. 60° W., dist. 112 lks. marked T 2 N R 34 E S 36 BT. No other tree in limits.

## MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES FOUND:

Found remains of Currin and Noland corner tree stump protruding 1' above ground. Remains of axe marks on rotted portions of the corner tree exist beside stump. Also found a 2 1/2" brass cap on a 2" galvanized iron pipe, marked as shown in monument marking detail, in a mound of stones at fence angle point bears: N 06° W, 2.0 from center of corner tree. I find no record for this brass cap monument which is believed to have been set by C.E. Redfield, U.S. Indian Service Surveyor, circa 1919. From the corner tree stump:

A 30" fir stump, 3 feet above ground level, badly decaying with no visible scribe marks, bears S 10° E, 112.9 feet. (Currin & Noland BT).

A 36" fir stump decaying badly, no visible marks, bears S 66° W, 44.2 feet.

A 26" diameter ponderosa pine stump, 3 feet above ground level, slightly burned but in good shape with no visible scribes bears N 60° W, 73.9 feet.

Attached bearing object tag to the pine stump as it is surely the original and in fine shape, the others are too badly rotten.

Added an arrow pointing to the true corner stump and added "WC" to top of witness corner monument. Also stamped WC N 06°W 2.0 ft. on the witness corner cap.

New accessories: (measured from center of corner tree stump):

A 5/8" iron rebar, 2" above ground level, with yellow plastic cap stamped "OR PLS 1106, WA PLS 17372", bears N 41° E, 43.7 feet.

A 5/8" iron rebar, 2" above ground level, with yellow plastic cap stamped "OR PLS 1106, WA PLS 17372", bears S 37° E, 20.8 feet.

A 14" fir scribed "T1N R34E S1 BT", bears S 41° W, 30.0 feet.

A 16" ponderosa pine scribed "T2N R34E S36 BT", bears N 14° W, 30.5 feet.
Nailed brass washers stamped "PLS 1106" in "B" of new scribes and attached bearing object and witness signs to trees.

Attached bearing object tags to 5/8" iron rebars. Attached witness sign to top of corner stump.
