Original corner evidence recovered:

Found the original corner stone solidly set in a small mound of stones. Corner stone is $25" \times 10" \times 6"$ and is marked "1/4" on the south face.

Monument and accessories established to perpetuate the original position of this corner:

In place of the original corner stone, I set a 1" x 30" flared, galvanized iron pipe 19" into the ground. A 2 1/2" brass cap attached to the top of the pipe is marked as shown in the diagram above. I bury the corner stone along the west side of the pipe and build a mound of stones around the pipe, from which:

A 5/8" x 24" iron rod set 23" into the ground with a 3/4" brass washer, marked "PLS 1636 NE", attached at ground level, bears N37° E, 74.7 feet.

A 5/8" x 24" iron rod set 16" into the ground with a 3/4" brass washer, marked "PLS 1636 SE", attached at ground level, bears S22° E, 59.3 feet.

A 5/8" x 24" iron rod set 20" into the ground with a 3/4" brass washer, marked "PLS 1636 SW", attached at ground level, bears S31° 30' W, 77.2 feet.

A 5/8" x 24" iron rod set 23" into the ground with a 3/4" brass washer, marked "PLS 1636 NW", attached at ground level, bears N19° 30' W, 54.3 feet.

I hereby certify the above corner point was perpetuated as hereon described on January 28, 2002. Magnetic declination set in compass: 18° E.
