History of original corner establishment:

The original corner was established by Daniel Chaplin on November 19, 1864, under GLO contract No. 107, as follows:

Set a stone, 22" x 8" x 6", for the corner to sections 14, 15, 22 and 23.

## Description of corner evidence found:

Found a stone broken into several pieces in a mound of stones. I reassemble the three largest pieces of the stone and find 3 notches on the edge of one piece and two notches on the edge of another piece. The reassembled stone measures  $22" \times 11" \times 5"$ .

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

In the center of the recovered mound of stones I set a 1 1/2" x 30" iron pipe 18" into the ground to bedrock. A 2 1/2" brass cap attached is marked as shown in the diagram above. I bury the three corner stone pieces around the pipe and build a mound of stones around the pipe, from which:

A 5/8" x 24" iron rod, set 23" into the ground with a 3/4" brass washer, marked "PLS 1636 S14", attached at ground level, bears N33 E, 113.6 feet. A 5/8" x 24" iron rod, set 20" into the ground with a 3/4" brass washer, marked "PLS 1636 S23", attached at ground level, bears S55 E, 97.7 feet. A 5/8" x 24" iron rod, set 23" into the ground with a 3/4" brass washer, marked "PLS 1636 S22", attached at ground level, bears S66 W, 121.9 feet. A 5/8" x 24" iron rod, set 23" into the ground with a 3/4" brass washer, marked "PLS 1636 S15", attached at ground level, bears N29 30'W, 110.3 feet.
