History of original corner establishment:

The original corner was established by Daniel Chaplin on November 18, 1864, under contract number 107, as follows:

Set stone 44" x 15" x 6" for the 1/4 section corner.

Description of corner evidence found:

Found a basalt stone, $39" \times 16" \times 6"$, plainly marked "1/4", lying on top of a mound of stones. Corner is about 50 feet east of a north-south barbed wire fence.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

In place of the corner stone, I set a $1\ 1/2$ " x 30" iron pipe 18" into the ground. A $2\ 1/2$ " brass cap attached is marked as shown in the diagram above. I place the corner stone along the south side of the pipe and build a mound of stones around the pipe to the cap, from which:

A basalt rock outcrop, 10' wide x 5' high is marked "+36" on the southwest face 36" above the ground. The "+" bears N42°30'E, 37.2 feet. A 5/8" x 24" iron rod, set 22" into the ground with a 5/8" brass washer, marked "PLS 1636 S36", attached at ground level, bears S34°E, 63.6 feet. A 5/8" x 24" iron rod, set 24" into the ground with a 1 1/2" aluminum cap attached marked "PLS 1636 S35" with an arrow pointing toward the corner, bears S47°W, 42.2 feet.
A 5/8" x 24" iron rod, set 22" into the ground with a 5/8" brass washer, marked "PLS 1636", attached at ground level, bears N41°W, 51.3 feet.

I hereby certify the above corner point was perpetuated as hereon descibed on November 11, 1996. Magnetic declination: 20°E.
