CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

Z - 13 DIAGRAM

History of original corner establishment:

The original corner was established by David P. Thompson on October 9, 1864, under GLO contract No. 106, as follows:

Set stone, 16" x 12" x 5", for corner to sections 3, 4, 33 and 34.

T2S R32E <u>S33 S34</u> S2 T3S R32E PLS 1636 1999

On May 27, 1882, George S. Pershin searched for
Thompson's corner, but did not find it. Pershin set a new corner of
minimum control, under GLO contract No. 430, as follows:
Set a basalt stone, 18" x 8" x 6", 12" into the ground, on a southwest
slope, marked with 3 notches on the east and west edges, from which:
A 36" pine bears N28 E, 102 links (67.32 feet).
A 16" pine bears N22 W, 70 links (46.2 feet).

On October 2, 1891, under GLO contract No. 551, John C. Arnold recovered a mound of stones at the corner. Arnold set a basalt stone, 12" x 10" x 5", marked with 3 notches on the east and west edges, in the recovered mound of stones, from which:

A 23" pine bears S10°W, 30 links (19.8 feet). A 32" pine bears S40°E, 90 links (59.4 feet).

Corner evidence recovered:

Found the original Arnold corner stone loosely set in a mound of stones. The corner stone is 14" x 11" x 5" and is plainly marked with 3 notches on the east and west edges, from which:

A broken and decayed 24" Ponderosa Pine stump with scribes "BT" visible bears S 9 W, 19.8 feet.

A sawn and decayed 36" Ponderosa Pine stump, no marks remaining, bears S52 E, 59.4 feet.

Monument and accessories established to perpetuate the original position of this corner:

At the point occupied by the corner stone, I set a 1" x 30" iron pipe, 18" into the ground surrounded by a mound of stones to the cap. A 2 1/2" brass cap attached is marked as shown in the diagram above. I bury the corner stone along the east side of the pipe, from which:
A 23" Ponderosa Pine, scribed "T2S R32E S34 BT", bears N4 E, 8.9 feet.
This tree has a "Bearing Object" sign nailed to the back.
A 15" Ponderosa Pine, scribed "T3S BT", bears S31 E, 121.8 feet.
A 8" Ponderosa Pine, scribed "T2S R32E S33 BT", bears N35 30'W, 62.7 feet. All four new bearing trees are scribed on double blazes, have a 3/4" brass washer, marked "PLS 1636", nailed flush to the scribed "B", and have a "Bearing Object" sign nailed above the blazes. The original bearing tree stumps have "Bearing Object" signs nailed to them.

I hereby certify the above corner point was perpetuated as hereon described on July 18, 1999. Magnetic declination: 18 E.
