History of original corner establishment: Corner was originally established by George S. Pershin, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, under Contract No. 319, dated March 26, 1879. The original notes state that at the corner a 12" x 10" x 8" basalt stone was set on SE face, from which:

A 5" dia Pine bears N70°E 49 lks dist. A 20" dia Pine bears N65°W 23 lks dist.

Description of corner evidence found:

3" brass cap on 2 1/2" I. pipe protruding 12" out of ground in mound of stone from which:

A 22" dia Pine Stump bears N61°W 17.3 ft dist tagged S61°E 17.31 ft dist-(old BT) visible scribing.

A 12" dia Red Fir bears \$52½° W 33.7 ft dist tagged N32½° E 51 lk dist - (recent blaze).

A 14" dia Tamarack bears S82°E 19.9 ft dist tagged N80°W 23½ lk dist - (recent blaze).

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Set steel fence post with 54-2 and 4 signs attached South of corner.

Blaze faces and 6" band around bearing trees are painted red. Tagged bearing trees with 54–3 and 4 signs Used steel tape and magnetic compass 19 3/4° East declination. Measured to center of BTs.

Corner was maintained on October 4, 1982.

History of 1978 BLM Remonumentation - (From BLM Field Notes)

The 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 35 and 36, monumented with the original basalt stone, $12 \times 10 \times 8$ ins., firmly set 6 ins. in the ground, and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 1 ft. high, mkd. 1/4 on W. face, from which the remains of an original bearing tree:
