A 20" dia Pine Stump bears N172°W 130.1 ft dist tagged S172°E 130.1 ft dist (old BT, visible scribing).

A 14" dia Pond. Pine bears N65°W 135.0 ft dist tagged S65°E 204 lk dist - recent blaze.

A 16" dia Pond. Pine bears N33½°E 79.9 ft dist tagged S34°W 121 lk dist.-recent blaze.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Blaze faces and 6" band around bearing trees are painted red. Tagged trees with 54-3 & 4 signs where needed.
