Set 2 1/2" brass cap on 2 1/2" x 30" 1. pipe 20" in ground with mound of stone from which:

A 18" dia Ponderosa Pine bears N81°W 85.5 ft dist marked: 1/4 S34 BT. A 16" dia Ponderosa Pine bears N33½°E 23.7 ft dist marked: 1/4 S34 BT.

Blaze faces and 6" band around bearing trees are painted red. Tagged trees with 54-3 & 4 signs. New BTs have a lower blaze, scribed BT, with brass washer stamped PLS 1106 nailed flush. Set steel fence post with 54-4 sign attached, East of corner.

Used steel tape and magnetic compass 19 3/4° East declination. Measured to center of BTs. Buried original stone monument upside down along new monument.

Corner monumented on October 7, 1982.
