History of original corner establishment:

Corner originally established by George S. Pershing in May, 1882, under contract number 430, as follows:

Set a basalt stone,  $14" \times 10" \times 4"$ , on S.W. slope marked 1/4 on west face, from which:

A 36" Pine bears S20°E, 77 links. (50.82 feet) A 26" Pine bears west, 80 links. (52.80 feet)

Description of corner evidence found:

Original corner stone, 16" x 11" x 4", is solidly set in a mound of stones. The stone is marked "1/4" on the west face, from which:

A sawn and decayed 29" Ponderosa Pine stump with scribe marks, "BT", visible, bears  $\mathrm{S14}^{\mathrm{O}}\mathrm{E}$ , 51.8 feet.

A 29" Ponderosa Pine with healed blaze bears N85°W, 52.8 feet.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the

original location of this corner:

Moving the corner stone aside, I set in it's place a 1 1/2" x 30" iron pipe 25" into the ground, with a 2 1/2" brass cap attached which is marked as shown in the diagram above. I bury the original corner stone up-side-down along the west side of the pipe and build a mound of stones around the monument. The corner is 3 feet west of a north-south fence. From which:

A 16" Ponderosa Pine, scribed "1/4 S16 BT", bears S65°W, 23.7 feet. A 17" Ponderosa Pine, scribed "1/4 S15 BT", bears S54°E, 34.5 feet. A 19" Ponderosa Pine, scribed "1/4 S15 BT", bears N81° 30'E, 34.1 feet.

The three new bearing trees are scribed on double blazes and have a 3/4" brass washer, marked "PLS 1636", nailed flush to the lower blaze. All bearing trees and the bearing tree stump have a reference point sign nailed above the blaze.

Magnetic declination: 20°E.
