3" brass cap on 2 1/2" 1. pipe 15" out of ground in mound of stone from which:

A 24" dia Ponderosa Pine bears N8½°W 139.0 ft dist tagged S9°E 211 lk dist (old BT healed blaze) A 26" dia Tamarack bears S39°W 58.6 ft dist tagged N38°E 90 lk dist (old BT open blaze) with visible scribing.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Set steel fence post with 54-2 and 4 signs West of corner.

Blaze faces and 6" band around bearing trees are painted red. Tagged trees with 54-3 and 4 signs. Used steel tape and magnetic compass 19 3/4° East declination. Measured to center of BTs.

Corner maintained on October 4, 1982.
