ORIGINAL DESCRIPTION: Set a post 4 ft long, 4 in. square 2 ft in ground on steep N. Slope for cor. to Sec. 21, 22, 27 and 28 (descend 80 ft) marked with 2 notches on S. and 3 notches on E edges; also T3S. S. 22 on N.E. R. 32 E S. 27 on S.E. S 28 on SW. and S. 21 on N.W.

A Tamarack 12 ins di. brs. N.45°E, 29 lks. dist marked T3S. R.32E S.22 B.T.

A Fir 9 ins di. brs. S.72°E, 41 lks dist marked T3S. R.32E. S.27 B.T.

A Tamarack 7 ins di. brs. S.55°W, 18 lks dist marked T3S. R.32E. S.28 B.T.

A Pine 5 ins di. brs. N.56°W, 13 lks dist marked T3S. R.32E. S.21 B.T.

1977 DESCRIPTION: The cor. of secs. 21, 22, 27, and 28, determined at record bearing and distance from the only remaining original bearing tree:

A larch, 16 ins. diam., bears S. 55° W., 18 lks dist., with healed blaze.

At the corner point Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, and in a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, to top, with brass cap mkd. (diagram shown) from which new bearing trees.

A grand fir, 9 ins. diam., bears N. 56° E., 32 lks. dist., mkd. T3S R32E S22 BT.

A grand fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 60° E., 42 lks. dist., mkd. T3S R32E S27 BT.

A grand fir, 9 ins. diam., bears N. 35° W., 29½ lks. dist., mkd. T3S R32E S21 BT.

1982 DESCRIPTION: Mr. Wells found the BLM brass cap and all four bearing trees. He set a steel fence post with 54-4 sign on the section line near the corner.

EVIDENCE FOUND: Found a 2½" galvanized iron pipe with 3½" BLM brass cap marked as shown below, projecting 1" above ground with no visible mound of stone, with green T-post south and alongside, with USFS sign 54-4 attached. From the found monument, a western larch 19" dbh, bears S.55°W., 11.0 ft. with healed blaze (GLO bearing tree) All other bearing trees of record are dead and down.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENTS AND ACCESSORIES SET AND METHODS USED:

I accept the found BLM monument as a perpetuation of the original corner.

From which, I SCRIBE NEW BEARING TREES:

- ► A white fir, 10" dbh, bears N.51°E., 20.78 ft. marked *T3SR32ES22* in upper blaze and *BT* in lower blaze
- ► A white fir, 8" dbh, bears S.77°E., 23.18 ft. marked X in upper blaze and BT in lower blaze
- ► A white fir, 14" dbh, bears N.74°W., 23.3 ft. marked *T3SR32ES21* in upper blaze and *BT* in lower blaze

CORNER MONUMENT MARKED:



Painted a 6 inch red band around each bearing tree, and also painted blazes red and attached USFS 54-3 and 54-9 signs. Distances to new BT's measured with a handheld EDM to a Mag Spike driven in the side-center at the root crown of each tree, with an attached $1\frac{1}{2}$ " aluminum washer stamped *PLS 69454*. Bearings measured with a magnetic compass with 14° east declination.
