Found western larch bearing tree, now a 22" cut, rotted stump, 2 1/2' above ground, with scribing "BT" visible after opening blaze. Nothing remains of the Fir bearing tree.

MONUMENT SET:

At a point North 88° West., 5.3' (8 lks) from face of blaze on western larch bearing tree stump, set a 2 1/2" brass cap on a 1 1/4" x 30" galvanized iron pipe 26" in the ground, surrounded with a mound of earth. Cap is marked as shown in "Monument Marking Detail".

New Accessories:

A 12" fir bears N 81°E., 13.3' scribed "1/4 S13 BT".

A 8" fir bears S 45°E., 33.9' scribed "1/4 S24 BT".

A 6" Ponderosa pine bears S 14°W., 9.8' scribed "1/4 S24 BT".

A 6" fir bears N 17°W., 17.0' scribed "1/4 S13 BT".

New bearing trees have a brass washer stamped "PLS 1106" nail to face of blaze, and a "bearing object" sign attached. Measurements to new bearing trees are to the center of tree.

Set steel fence post South of Corner monument and attached "witness" sign.

LOCATION AND COMMENTS: Corner falls on steep Northeast slope in second growth timber 30 to 50 feet high.
