History of original corner establishment:

This corner was originally established by Milliam Odell, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, under Contract No. 114, dated July 2, 1866. The original notes state that at the corner a post was set for the corner from whith:

A 10" fir bears \$20"W 46 lks. A 20" pine bears \$33"W 41 lks.

This corner was also recovered by surveyor John Kimbrell, during his County Survey No. 93, in 1897.

Description of corner evidence found:

A 30" live ponderosa pine bears N33°W 27.1', with scribes "BT" visible on open lower blaze.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

At a point \$33°E 27.1 feet from the found bearing tree, set a 2 1/2" brass cap on 1 1/2" by 30" galv. iron pipe, 15" in the ground and surrounded with a mound of earth and stone. From the new monument:

A 16" douglas fir bears \$47°W 41.9' scribed 1/4 \$33 BT.

Placed bearing object signs on each bearing tree and set a steel fence post east of corner with witness corner sign attached.

There is a fence corner 20' north and 10' east of the corner point. The fences go west and south.
