Description of corner evidence found:

None, except for fence lines.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the

original location of this corner:

Reestablished corner at the intersection of the Southerly projection of an old fence running South from the Northeast corner of Section 34, (fence is visible North of Pine Creek), and an East-West fence. At the reestablished corner position, I set a 2 1/2" brass cap on a 1 1/2" by 30" galv. iron pipe, 29" in the ground. From the reestablished corner monument:

A 19" ponderosa pine bears N71°E 48.3'. A 17" ponderosa pine bears 827°W 87.4'.

Bearing trees have a bearing object sign attached to them. Set a steel fence post 7.5' East of corner and attached a witness corner sign and a bearing object sign.

The reestablished corner position matches physical improvements in the area including the west edge of the cleared pasture to the south. There are two east-west fences in the area, an older fence and a new fence. The corner was reestablished based on the position of the old fence east and west of the reestablished corner position.
