
History of original corner establishment:

This corner was found by Donald L. Staebler, as shown on surwey number I=156-B, as filed in the office of the Umatilla County Surveyor. On his survey he states that he found a stake and BT stump NOT of record. Staebler remonumented the corner with brass cap with the Umatilla County Surveyor logo, marked as shown below.



No subsequent remonumentation was found in the Umatilla County survey records Description of corner evidence found:

Found a 1 inch galvanized iron pipe with brass cap marked as shown below, loose in the ground, 16 inches exposed

Found old BT, a 10 inch stump loose upon the ground, scribes visible. Unable to determine species of tree.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner: I lowered and tightened the existing brass cap to 4 inches exposure. From which:

A 10 inch diameter stump bears South, 6.0 feet loose upon the ground, scribes visible

A 19 inch diameter Tamarack bears \$570E, 32.6 feet marked X BT on a single blaze A 17 inch diameter Tamarack bears \$45°W, 9.3 feet marked C4 \$32 BT on a single blaze

and 54-9 signs and approximately 5 feet West with 54-2 signs attached

I used a steel tape and magnetic compass in the establishment of these accessories. I used 20° East magnetic declination and the distances are to the center of the trees. I placed a brass washer marked OPLS 991 to the BT blaze of the new BTs. I painted a 6 inch red band around all BTs and attached 54-9 and 54-3 signs.
