Description of corner evidence found:

Found original stone 17x12x5.

Found a 12.5" L. Pine, dead and down, bearing S76°W, 49.5 ft. scribing visible "T4S R33E S24 BT". Its root hole is still there with a 4" L. Pine growing in it.

Note: Original notes called: set corner at 80 chains. And when he went north on east boundary of S13, he tied to creek at 0.1 chains. Apparently the creek has changed courses in 100 years.
