Set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Brass Cap on a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30" Galvanized pipe set 15" in ground marked as shown:

Raised rock mound 2 feet in dia. from which:

A 12" Ponderosa Pine bears S $69^{0}45$ 'W 37.70 feet scribed ½ S 35 BT A 14" Ponderosa Pine bears N $68^{0}45$ 'W 42.60 feet scribed ½ S 26 BT

Blazes are painted red, trees have a red band painted around them and signs number 54-3, 54-4 and Brass Washers stamepd PLS 933 nailed to them.

Bearings were run with a staff compass set at a declination of $19^{\circ}30\,{}^{\circ}\text{E}$ distances were measured with a steel tape to the center of the tree.
