Found stone 14" X 8" X 7" with marks in mound of stone, from which: A 16" Lodgepole Pine bears S 8° W, 67.3 ft. scribes visible.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner

At corner position I set 2 1/2" X 30" iron pipe with brass cap marked as shown 24" in ground, from which: New BTs:

A 8" Lodgepole Pine bears N 61° E, 174.5 ft. marked T4S R33E S34 BT.

A 20" Lodgepole Pine bears S 78° E, 76.4 ft. marked T5 S R33E S3 BT.

A 8" Lodgepole Pine bears S 31° W, 63.5 ft. marked T5S R33E S4 BT.

Buried stone West and along side pipe. Raised mound of stone 3 ft. base to top of cap. Set steel fence post 5+ ft. East.
