## CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

Section corner common to Sections 3, 4, 9 \$ 10, Township 5 North, Range 37 East, of the Millamette Meridian, Umatilia County, Oregon.

History of original corner establishment: GLO:


George Milliams, Deputy Surveyor, Contract No. 176, 20 July, 1872: "Set Stone 10 x 12 x 14 for Cor to Sec. 3, 4, 9 \$ 10." E-13

Description of evidence found:

I searched diligently, but could find no evidence of the monument established by Milliams for this corner. I also searched diligently for the one-quarter corner common to Sections 3 and 10, the Section corner common to Sections 2, 3, 10 4 II, and the one-quarter corner common to Sections 2 \$ II, but could find no trace of the original monuments or their accessories, if any.

An ancient barbed nire fence extends southerly and mesterly from this position. Testimony of local residents dates this fence to be at least 80 years old. I accept the corner position as determined by intersecting these two fencelines to be the best evidence of the original

position for this corner.



Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

At the corner of the two fencelines computed above, I set a standard I" dia. "Hoffland" galvanized iron pipe with 2-1/2" Bronze cap marked as shorn, top flush with the surface of the ground, from which

A 5/8"x30" iron rebar with Yellow Plastic Cap mkd. "Tomkins Surveying" for a bearing object, top driven 2 inches belon the surface of the ground at the southerly side of a "fence jack", bears 556 54E, a distance of 14.39 feet. I affixed a Umatilla County Surveyor Yellow Metal Bearing Object sign and a Yellow Metal Survey Monument sign (penalty for disturbance, etc.) to the fence posts comprising this "jack".

A 5/8"x30" Iron rebar with Yellow Plastic Cap mkd. "Tomkine Surveying" for a bearing object, top driven within 2 inches of the surface of the ground at the easterly side of a "fence jack" in the barbed mire fence extending southerly, bears \$2°14'47"M, a distance of 17.08 feet. I affixed a Umatilla County Surveyor Yellon Metal Bearing Object sign and a Yellon Metal Survey Monument sign (penalty for disturbance, etc.) to the fence posts comprising this "jack".

A 5/8"x30" Iron rebar with Yellow Plastic Cap mkd. "Tomkins Surveying" for a bearing object, top driven within 3 inches of the surface of the ground at the northerly side of a "fence jack" in the barbed wire fence extending westerly, bears N87°54'27"M, a distance of 96.54 feet. I affixed a Umatilia County Surveyor Yellow Metal Bearing Object sign and a Yellow Metal Survey Monument sign (penalty for disturbance, etc.) to the fence posts comprising this "jack".

A 5/8"x90" iron rebar with Yellow Plastic Cap mkd.
"Tomkins Surveying", top driven 2 inches below the surface
of the ground for a bearing object, bears NB8"01'02"W, a distance of 5.80 feet.

A 6.0 ft. studded "T" steel fence post driven 1.5 feet into the ground bears North, a distance of 1.0 feet.
