Description of evidence found:

Found evidence of a fence corner at an intersection of an ancient fence bearing northerly into this corner and another ancient fence bearing easterly out of this corner. A row of trees some 90+ years old straddles the northerly bearing fence.



Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

I set a I" standard "Hoffland" galvanized iron pipe with 2-1/2" Bronze cap marked as shown, flush with the surface of the ground, from which:

A 20 in. dia. Douglas Fir bears N9°80'M, a distance of 26.96 feet to center, with face mkd. "Ci/49i2BT". An Aluminum nail is driven into a 3/4 in. Brass washer mkd. "PLS 2360" in the center of the "B" marked on the face which is typical for all bearing trees marked at this position.

A 19 In. dia. Engelman Spruce bears N27°E, a distance of 26.50 feet to center, with face mkd. "CI/4SI2BT".

A 17-1/2 In. dia. Douglas Fir bears 568°E, a distance of 14.34 feet to center, with face mkd. "CI/4SI2BT".

An II-I/2 in. dia. Engelman Spruce bears \$60°30'W, a distance of 22.50 feet to center, with face mkd. "CI/4612BT".

I affixed Umatilia County Surveyor Yellon Metal Bearing Object signs to these Bearing Trees. I also affixed Bearing Tree signs (penalty for disturbance, etc.) to each tree.

Bearings are magnetic using a "Silva Ranger" compass, with a declination of 19°E, calibrated to true bearing from Solar observations.
