A Pine 28 in. dia. bears N 22 W, 100 lks. dist. A Pine 20 in. dia. bears S 28 E, 15 lks. dist.

Description of corner evidence found:

Found stone call size marked \$\frac{1}{4}\$ 60 ft. NW. of corner.

Found 28" P. Pine stump, scribes visable.

Found 36" P.Pine, scribes visable (fence corners here.)

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner

At record distances from the SE and the NW BT I set $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30" iron pipe with brass cap marked as shown 12" in ground from which:


Original BTs:

A 36" P. Pine bears S 45 E, 10.0 ft. scribes visable. A 28" P.Pine stump bears N 22 W, 66.0 ft. scribes visable.

New BT:

A 28" P.Pine bears N 13 W, 67.9 ft. marked T5S R33E $\frac{1}{4}$ S16 BT.

Set steel fence posts 5 tast and South. Buried stone North and alongside pipe. Raised mound of stone 3' base to top of cap.





Brass washer nailed to BT blazes. Used steel tape and magnetic compass with 19° 30' East declination. Measured to center of BTs.
