1 HISTORY

Corner originally established by Daniel G. Major under Contract No. 72, dated May 5, 1863. Record states: Set section post for corner to Sections 10, 11,14, 15 on side of high mountain ridge, bearing NW. Bearing to rock on W side of ridge N 30°38' E dist. 3/4 m. To the most Westerly of a number of prominent rocks, on top of ridge N 12°05' W dist. 3 1/2 miles.

2. EVIDENCE FOUND: Found small circle of stones, 3 feet in diameter, on flat spot in extremely steep East slope of ridge—stones all evenly spaced and arranged in a circle---- a cute little monument! This area has not been disturbed, hardly even by cattle, because it is so steep. Major's record accessory bearings fit reasonably well, when measured with a hand compass.

3. PERPETUATION INFORMATION:

At center of the circle of stones, set a 2 1/2" aluminum cap on a 2 1/2" x 30" aluminum pipe, Cap of monument is , 4" above ground level, marked as shown below:

From which:

A 5/8" x 30" iron rebar with yellow plastic cap stamped "OR PLS 1106 WA PLS 17372", bears S 38° E, 41.5 feet. A 5/8" x 30" iron rebar with yellow plastic cap stamped "OR PLS 1106 WA PLS 17372", bears N 38 1/2° W, 41.7 feet.

Set a steel fence post near new corner monument. Compass declination 18°East.
