## PREVIOUS RENEWALS/SURVEYS ETC:

Originally surveyed by George Williams in 1872 his notes state "Set rock 6x10x16 in mound of rock with pits for  $\frac{1}{4}$  section corner.

BLM Cadastral Surveyor C. Alfred White in 1965 stated in his notes: The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 23 and 26, monumented with original basalt stone, 16 x 12 x 6 ins., marked ¼ on one face, lying in a rock crib, 4 ft. square, 2 ft. high at the cor. of wire fences which bear irregularly N. 10° E., S., and W. from this point.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., 18 ins. in the ground, to solid rock, and in a mound of stone,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ft. base, to top, with a brass cap marked

No trees available.

The corner is located at the NE. corner of the rock crib.

Surveyor Paul W.P. Tomkins noted in his February 15, 1996 survey, shown on Umatilla County Survey record of surveys 99-121-B, "North ¼ Corner of Section 26, and South ¼ Corner Section 23. History: Corner was originally established in 1872, by George Williams, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, under contract No. 176, as a rock 6x10x16, mound of rock, with pits. The BLM (Bureau of Land Management) in 1965 restored the 1872 survey by George Williams by setting for the corner a brass cap stamped "¼ S23/26 T 6N, R 37E 1965" in mound of stone 4' square and 2' high, original basalt stone marked ¼ on one face lying in rock crib. Evidence found: A brass cap stamped "¼ S23/26 T 6N, R 37E 1965" protruding 8" above ground, fence corner to South and West 4' southwest. Corner Perpetuation: None.

### MOUNUMENT AND ACCESSORIES FOUND:

Found a 3½ BLM brass cap on a 2½ inch iron pipe marked ¼ S23 and S26 1965, in the ground, next to a fence corner crib, from which a fence line runs S10°E and N75°W.
