No record of subsequent remonumentation found in County Records. Description of corner evidence found:

I did not find the original corner post. I establish this corner from 2 live original bearing trees. From the corner point:

A 20" pine bears S. 49° E. 108.9 feet with scribing visible in opened blaze. A 21^n pine bears S. 50° W. 29.7 feet marked S. 3 CC BT. A stump hole bears North 13.2 ft. no remains of BT.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

At the corner point: Set a $2\frac{1}{2}$ "x30" galvanized iron pipe 22" in the ground with brass cap marked as shown.

As both original BTs are healthy I do not scribe new BTs. Set steel fence post 5 ft. East of corner. Raised a mound of stone, 3 ft. base to top of pipe. Corner is 50 ft. South of E-W fenceline. Used compass with 20° E. Variation and steel tape, measuring to face of blaze of old BTs.
