
## TOWNSHIP 6 SOUTH, RANGE 30 EAST, OF THE WILLAMETTE MERIDIAN, OREGON



A history of surveys is contained in the field

This pilot represents a dependent resurvey of a portion of the south boundary and subdivisional lines, T. 6. S., R. 30. E., Williamette Meridian, Oragen, designed to restore the corners in their true original locations, according to the best ovaliable evidence, the subdivision of section 35, metas-and-bounds survey of lot 3 in section 35, and parcels A and B in section 35, and parcels A and B in section 35.

Actual quantity acreages have been returned in fabular form for the federal interest lands where indicated. The cliquot parts and lots will retain their designation even though the official acreage has shanged. The aliquot part of a section will continue to be subdivided by legal subdivision in accordance with the Manual. When on area has been assigned a lot number, it may be further subdivided only by a supplemental plot or another official survey. Where not indicated, the official lottings and cross not affected by this survey are as shown on the plot approved November 23, 1881.

Measured distances and directions have been adjusted by computer software that incorporates a least squares adjustment routine. The adjusted bearings and distances are reported to the nearest second and C.01 foot.

The tie to the geodetic control station is reported as mean bearing and sea level distance.

The survey was executed by David A. Schloich, Land Surveyor, U.S. Forest Service, beginning April 13, 2006, and completed February 23, 2007, pursuant to Special instructions deted June 15, 2005, and Supplemental Special Instructions dated December 7, 2006, under Group Number 2128, Oregon.
