A pine 16 ins. in diam. bears S.15° E. 40 lks. dist., marked R35 E S8 B.T. A fir 14 ins. in diam. bears S.35° W. 35 lks. dist., marked T.1 N.S.7 B.T. A fir 18 ins. in diam. bears N75° W 70 lks dist., marked R.35 E. S.6 B.T. Land, rough and mountainous 80.00 chains, badly broken by small ridges and canons. Soil, 2nd rate, unfit for any- thing but pasture. Fine bunch grass. Timber, pine and fir in canons and on S. hill sides.
