Chains	R.R. track.
2.00	Leave R.R. - ascend over broken ground.
40.15	Set a fir post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. square, 24 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. on N. face; from which A pine 22 ins. in diam. bears S. $56\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 10 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. B. T., and A fir 14 ins. in diam. bears N. 89° E. 12 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. B. T.
	Descend.
77.30	Creek 2 lks. wide, course S.W. Ascend.
80.30	The cor. to secs. 25, 26, 35 and 36. Land, mountainous, 80.30 chs. Soil, sandy loam, 3d rate. Timber, scattering pine, fir and tamarac. Undergrowth, pine, fir and tamarac. Mountainous lands 80.30 chs.
