General Description

The land in this township is all rough and mountainous with the exception of a small strip from 10 to 20 chs. in width along Meacham creek. The soil along Meacham creek is mostly a fair quality of 2nd rate, and the soil on the mountainous part is mostly 3rd rate, part of it being very stony. The entire township is covered with scattering fir, pine and tamarack timber. The timber is of good quality but is not abundant enough to be of much importance. The Baker City branch of the Oregon Railway and Navigation Co's. line is at present being constructed along the Meacham creek canyon in this township. There is one settler each in secs. 9 and 34, and a sawmill in sec. 27.
