General Description

General description of Tp. consists chiefly of rolling land with small draws, running to the Meacham Creek on the East and Mc Kay on the South and West.

There is pine, fir, tamarack and spruce timber, over nearly the whole Tp., but very scattering in places and on the whole of little value.

There is good grass, where timber and underbrush is not too thick.

Water is very scarce late in the summer.

Soil in places, 1st rate, but is generally rocky and will average about 2nd rate.
