40.00	Set post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. Cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. on W. face, from which, A fir, 6 ins. diam., brs. $S.40^{\circ}E.$ , 9 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S., B.T. A fir, 10 ins. diam., brs. $S.25^{\circ}W.$ , 7 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S., B.T.
75.36	Intersect the Base Line at a point 18.75 chs. E. of Cor. to Secs. 32 & 33, T.1 N., R.36 E. Set post, 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in ground for Closing Cor. to Secs. 4 & 5, marked C.C. T.1 S., R.36 E. on S. S.4 on E. and S.5 on W. faces, with 4 notches on E. and 2 notches on W. edges, from which, A fir, 24 ins. diam., brs. $S.32^{\circ}E.$ , 20 lks. dist., marked T.1 S., R.36 E., S.4, B.T. A fir, 16 ins. diam., brs. $S.65^{\circ}W.$ , 28 lks. dist., marked T.1 S., R.36 E., S.5, B.T. No other tree within limits and raised mound of stone around it best. Land; mountainous. Soil; 2nd rate. Timber; scattering pine, fir and tamarack, with dense undergrowth of sage and buck brush.
	From the Cor. to Secs. 5, 6, 31 & 32 on the S. Bdy., which is a basalt stone, 18 x 12 x 3 ins., marked with 5 notches on E. and 1 notch on W. edges, from which, A pine, 7 ins. diam., brs. $N.45^{\circ}E.$ , 3 lks. dist., marked T.1 S., R.36 E., S.32, B.T. A pine, 10 ins. diam., brs. $N.58^{\circ}W.$ , 18 lks. dist., marked T.1 S., R.36 E., S.31, B.T. A pine, 12 ins. diam., brs. $S.52^{\circ}W.$ , 33 lks. dist.
