	<p>From the cor. of Secs. 25, 26, 35 and 36, thence I run S 0° 01' E., on random line, bet Secs. 35 and 36.</p>
40.00	<p>Set temp. <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> Sec. cor.</p>
79.21	<p>Intersect S bdy. of tps., 65 lks. E. of the cor. of Secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36. heretofore described.</p> <p>I destroy all marks on old cornepertaining to the survey N.</p> <p>At the point of intersection I set ironstone, 15x12x6 ins. 10 ins. in the ground for closing cor. of Secs. 35 and 36 marked C C on N face, with 1 groove on E. and 5 grooves on W. faces; from which</p> <p>A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N. 15° E., 46 lks. dist., marked T 2 N R 37 E., S 36. B T.</p> <p>A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N. 14° W. 43 lks. dist., marked T 2 N R 37 E., S 35 B T.</p> <p>Thence I run N. 0° 01' W. on true line, bet Secs. 35 and 36.</p> <p>Ascend gradually through heavy timber.</p>
