

Subdivisions of T. 2 N R 37 E. W. M.

Chains.	
	dist., marked T 2 N R 37 E., S 6 B T. Thence I run S 0° 05' E. on true line, bet. Secs. 5 and 6. Ascend gradually.
4.50	Enter heavy timber, bears N. E., S. W. Ascend steep N. slope.
21.00	Top of ridge, 200 ft. above closing cor., bears E. and W. Descend through scattering timber bears E. and W.
29.15	Ravine, 100 ft. deep, course E. Ascend N. slope of ridge.
35.25	Set ironstone, 24x10x4 ins., 18 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W. face, from which A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 60° E., 29 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 5 B T. A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 33° W., 25 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 6 B T.
41.00	Top of branch ridge, 150 ft. high, bears E. and W. Descend along steep S. E. slope, mountain bears N. 30° E., S. 30° W.
70.00	Enter heavy timber, bears N. E. and S. W.
71.00	Foot of mountain, 300 ft. below ridge.
73.25	S. Fork Umatilla River, slow current, stony bottom, 50 lks. wide, course N. 60° E., S. 10° W. Over bottom not subject to inundation.
74.75	Ascend steep W. slope of mountain.
75.25	The cor. of Secs. 5, 6, 7 and 8. Land, mountainous. Soil, stony and gravelly loam; 3rd 4th and 2nd rate. Timber, fir, pine, spruce, larch and tamarack. Mountainous land. 75.25 chs. August 8, 1901
