## General Description

This survey is made for the purpose of defining the boundaries of Tract No.37, containing 8.30 acres and lying along the south and east sides of old Lot 9, Section 34, T. 3 N., R. 35 E.

The tract is in itself apparently a worthless strip of land, the soil being composed of river sand and gravel on the Umatilla River bottom, and is covered over the larger portion with a scattering growth of balm and pine trees, with a dense growth of underbrush consisting mainly of thorn, briars and vines

Within the boundaries of the tract are located the extreme head works of the City of Pendleton water system, this consisting merely of an underground conduit into which the waters of several strong springs are permitted to enter, their combined strength furnishing the City's water supply.
