11.75	Top of ridge brs. N.E. & S.W., 500 ft. above Sec. Cor., impossible to chain. Send flag ahead to point on line and run a Base, 400 lks. W., gives an angle of 5° 15', Base multiplied by Nat. Cotan. of angle gives 4352 lks. to flag plus 1175 lks. gives
55.27	To flag from last Sec. Cor. Impracticable to set the $\frac{1}{4}$ Cor. bet. Secs. 19 & 24, on account of rough and broken ground.
59.00	Top of high ridge brs. N.W. & S.E., 500 ft. above top of last ridge, and Descend.
63.25	Ravine, course E., 100 ft. below top of ridge and Ascend.
66.50	Top fo ridge brs. E.& W., 100 ft. above last ravine.
68.10	Ravine, course E., 100 ft. below top of last ridge and Ascend.
