

4000 found no $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. corner

making an excess
of 115 lks over U.S.
Field Notes,

I therefore run North var 20° E. and at
8057 Set Stone 10 x 10 x 30 inch in mound of stone on North side
of Mountain slope 50 lks North of R. 16. Liack.
from this corner I run East var 19° E
4000 Found no $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec corner
8023 Intersect East Boundary 97 lks South of corner Sec 29 = 30 - 3183.
from which you West var 20° E
4012 Set Stake for $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec corner
The $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec corner on North Boundary Sec 30 Shadout var 20° E
2000 Set Lemm's Stake $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec corner
4000 Set " Stake for center Sec 30
8061 Intersect South Boundary 92 lks East of $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec corner
the $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec corner on East Boundary Sec 30
hence West var 20° E
4028 Intersect N & S line 15 lks North of center
