Public hearing will be held May 16, 1990 at 10:00 along with the county budget hearing.

CIS-Correspondence has been received from Schroth Insurance asking the county adopt a resolution for the current fiscal year. Actually the resolution should have been adopted last year, but was overlooked. The resolution indicates the county is willing to become a member of the CIS trust for workers compensation for a period of three years commencing July 1, 1989 and agrees to abide by those stipulations spelled out in the contract.

Commissioner Youngman motioned to enroll as a member in CIS; seconded by Commissioner Hughes and motion carried. A copy of the signed resolution is filed under Workers Compensation.

OTHER BUSINESS

Vector Control-Byron Grow indicates interest in filling Position #2 since Ted Thornstad indicates he no longer wishes to serve another term. Commissioner Youngman motioned to appoint Byron Grow to the Umatilla County Vector Control Board of Directors; seconded by Commissioner Hughes and motion carried.

Noxious Weed List-during an administrative meeting, the Board discussed changes to this list with Mary Corp. After checking with the Sheriff and the D.A., Commissioner Hansell suggests approving the weed list as presented except keep Camelthorn and Marijuana on the A List. Commissioner Youngman motioned to approve as suggested by Commissioner Hansell; seconded by Commissioner Hughes and motion carried. (Note: a copy of the proposal is filed under Umatilla County Departments, Weed Control).

Solid Waste amendments-First reading has already been held; the seconded reading is also by title only. Commissioner Hansell reads the Solid Waste Ordinance by title only. Commissioner Youngman motioned to approve Ordinance 90-07 "Relating to accumulation, storage, collection, transportation and disposal of wastes and solid wastes; prescribing an effective date and declaring an emergency." Seconded by Commissioner Hughes and motion carried.

Road Department; Kik Property, Charles Tracts-Recommendation from Road Department is to approve. Commissioner Hansell opens the hearing and calls for comments.

Merle Jewett noted they own the property just to the north and are in favor of this vacation.

Arletta Sams, of Columbia Bus company, noted the Company is also in favor.

Commissioner Hansell called for further comments. There being none, he closed this hearing.

Commissioner Youngman motioned to approve vacation of West third in Charles Tracts; seconded by Commissioner Hughes and motion carried with no objection.

Paving of Road to Pilot Rock Cemetery; Roy Thurman, Assistant Road Master, looked at this road and it shows some deterioration caused by flood irrigation waters. Whatever money is put into repairing the road will be money down the tube unless the flooding stops. Actually the road is not too bad except for some 8 - 10 pot holes which can be patched and would bring the road into fairly good condition. It would cost somewhere around \$5500 - \$6000 to pave nearly one half mile versus \$200-\$300 to patch the chuck holes.

In that the county does not want to spend money on public roads, paving is out of the question. However, there is little objection on the Board's part in patching the holes while in the area.

Roy will contact Jack Sturtevant on this request. (Mr. Sturtevant is one of the gentlemen who brought this request to the Board).

Enforcement Ordinance Orders-in that the planning department has not had time to review the orders, specifically #9, this item will be discussed at the Board's administrative meeting Tuesday, April 24.

Roads 900 and 908; Roy explained these roads were transferred to the BIA so that work could be done to them. The agreement is that when the work is completed, they will be transferred back to the county. It is now at that point in time when the County agrees to the transfer.

Commissioner Hughes motioned to accept the transfer of road from BIA to county, involving portions of roads 900 and 908; seconded by Commissioner Youngman and motion carried with no objection. Board then signed the road order, R-1.

Clock logo-there is some concern that certain individuals are using the clock tower logo on their letterhead. The Board understood that the architect and the designer have ownership of the clock tower logo and it is up to them to work out who uses the logo.

Virginia Jones; Nuisance Abatement Ordinance-Ms. Jones spoke to the Board about a particular parcel causing some problems in the downtown Pilot Rock area.
